We are thrilled that the White House has released a Work-Flex Event Starter Kit – to continue the groundbreaking, national conversation that began in March at the White House Forum on Workplace Flexibility.

The Work-Flex Event Starter Kit is designed to provide businesses, local elected officials, community organizations, academic institutions and other groups with the resources needed to host their own event on workplace flexibility, and to engage in meaningful dialogue on the benefits flexibility can provide to employers, employees and communities. Using the Kit, organizers can register their event with the White House, and share feedback with the Administration on progress that is being made across the country.

We strongly encourage small business owners, corporate leaders, employees, labor leaders, researchers, advocates and others to use the Starter Kit, and to keep the national conversation on workplace flexibility moving forward.
